Timbeaux's on the Square in Downtown Hernando has been a local favorite since its doors first opened in 2002. The restaurant offers a broad variety of Cajun cuisine and is known to cause somewhat of a parking dilemma in downtown Hernando with its high volume of traffic.

Ken Jeffcoat, General Manager of Timbeaux's, has been running the restaurant since 2003. He's seen quite a few changes during his tenure there, including the transfer of Timbeaux's ownership five months ago to Three Square Meals, LLC. Right away the new owners prepared for extensive renovations by extending the West side of the restaurant to offer outdoor seating year round; lengthening the front walk of the premises into the front and sides streets; and redesigning ramps to make it easier and more comfortable for disabled diners.


Other changes include an update to the already popular menu. Jeffcoat claims these changes make Timbeaux's "better than ever, offering a better quality of food and atmosphere". In fact, it was Jeffcoat who spent two months creating the new lunch menu which reflects the requests and suggestions of his customers. Jeff adds, "We've added appetizers, more hot sandwiches and updated the plate lunch specials". So far, the changes have been exceptionally well received by Timbeaux's customers.

Popular dinner items will stay on the menu, such as their signature menu item, Shrimp & Grits and Black & Bleu: a ten ounce center cut filet with bleu cheese mashed potatoes, finished with a cane syrup demi-glaze. A couple of items added to the menu include Cayman Style Trout and The Malcom: a black angus 14 ounce rib eye, blackened and served with four creole seasoned jumbo gulf shrimp, served with garlic leek mashed potatoes and drawn butter.

Whether you are dining at Timbeaux's for lunch or dinner, you will no doubt, find something appetizing. The lunch menu is more affordable and offers good, country, home-town food items, while the dinner menu provides a stronger Cajun influence in its choice.

Timbeaux's also offers banquet dining and custom menus for large parties. "Our private dining facility comfortably accommodates sixty people and can be used for whatever our customers want, such as rehearsal dinners, company and Christmas parties, suggests Jeffcoat.


The Timbeaux's staff completes extensive training, including a 77 question test in the process. "If they don't pass at least 70, I don't put them on the floor", Jeffcoat advises. In fact, last month, the Timbeaux's staff completed a mandatory 7 hour training process.



specializing in food description, table side service and wine training.

Jeffcoat hopes to continue offering great service and food to the public, "We want to do more than feed our customers. We want to create an experience that will help them realize that we are the best restaurant in the Memphis area and hope that they will return again and again," he states.

But all these changes won't alter the core of Timbeaux's Cajun influenced menu selections. Jeffcoat explains, "The restaurant has always had this influence and always will." If you are hoping to visit Southern Louisiana without leaving your backyard, a trip to Timbeaux's will take you very close.

Always consider the purpose of the statuary; then choose the proper size and style for your location.

One common mistake is overdoing it. Plants should frame the statues, not the opposite. Too much concrete overwhelms the flowers and shrubs and has a gaudy, cheap effect instead of enhancing the landscape.
